Who doesn't need a little or a lot of help with organizing their stash?? And don't you just love things that make quilting easier and more fun?? Penny Haren is here to help! She is a ruler designer and teacher from Newark, Ohio who has been quilting for over 30 years. Penny began developing and teaching techniques that made it quick, easy and fun for quilters - even beginners – to create intricate blocks with stunning results. These techniques were published through Landauer Publishing in a series of 5 books based on the Pieced Appliqué method. Penny has designed several rulers with Creative Grids as well as notions such as Print N Fuse and Batting by the Bolt which are sold in Independent quilt shops worldwide. She will do a trunk show and lecture called Bust Your Stash With Creative Grids. She will show you how, with the right tools, you can bust your stash in a matter of minutes and teach you how to organize your fabric so it becomes the foundation for your next heirloom quality quilt. Penny will have rulers, patterns and books for you to order and purchase. Bring money!! Checks and credit cards are accepted. Also, you may want to bring paper and pencil to take notes After lunch, Penny will conduct a technique class which is great for newbies as well as very experienced quilters. The price of the kit is \$8.00...which includes 5-6 precut blocks. You will learn how easy it is to make blocks using the Creative Grids rulers. Fortytwo ladies have signed up to participate. Due to space limitations you will want to team up with a friend, 2 people can share I machine. One can sew while the other cuts and presses, then you can switch off. On page 2 you will find the list of "what to bring," as well as the names of those signed up for the class.

Baby Kits and Pillowcases – New baby kits and pillowcases are ready to be taken home and sewn.

Fascinator Challenge Due - Bring your Fascinator. If you missed the Jan meeting, it's based on those crazy hats British Ladies wear balanced on the side of their heads. Your Fascinator should reflect your personality and interests. We suggest you use a circle of cardboard sewn to a headband for the base Putting 2 small holes about 1/2" apart in the cardboard before sewing to headband will make it easy to sew. The circle can be no larger than 6." If you want an oval base, the oval can be no larger than 6 at it's widest point. Cover the cardboard with fabric (a giant yo-yo makes it easy) and decorate it any way you wish. At the meeting, wear your fascinator and we will pin a number on you for members to use in the voting. 

You must present your receipt at quilt pick-up on Saturday, February 27th between 5:00 - 5:30.










Mystery Quilt Clue 1

Cut 7 strips of fabric "A" at 2 inches Cut 7 strips of fabric "C" at 2 inches


Sew one "A" strip to a strip of "C" fabric. Press towards the "C" strip. Make 7 sets like this.



Sub-cut 2-inch units from the sets you made. You need 144 units.




Using the units you just cut, make 72 four-patch blocks.

(it can be made shorter by switching out the galvanized pipes) It has a stitch regulator, bobbin winder, laser pointer (for use with pantograms), 2 extension tables. I converted the adjusting knobs to Bowers lifters. I am also including the side saddle rolling chair. I paid \$5595 and will sell complete for \$3500.00.





Janome Memory Craft 10001 - This is an embroidery machine but it also is great for everyday sewing. It has over 240 decorative stitches built in, plus 4 or 5 fonts. I have purchased many additional hoops that will be included. It also has a hard sided case for traveling. This machine works great! Paid \$3000.00 - will sell for \$1000.00 It was recently serviced.
